- GUY: Oh, I get it! Since He does good things in the world for people, we should be doing the same. In that way we are mirrors of God's love.
- GIRL: That's exactly right. A mirror of God's love—let's find someone at school tomorrow who needs a friend. Okay?
- GUY: Great! It's time for church now. Let's go.
- GIRL: All right, and on our way, let's look closely at other people and see if we see God's image in them.
